Permian South Forty To Be Track Area

Construction is under way on the new track for Permian High. It is being built south of the building running parallel with Dawn Ave. The oval cinder track will be a regulation 440-yds. It will have a 220-yd straight away which will be 24 feet wide. In this 24 feet there will be eight 3-foot lanes. At each end of the oval field the cindered track will be 21 feet wide containing seven 3-foot lanes.

The cinders will be curbed with a six by twelve inches of reinforcement cement. Inside these curbs will be one inch of crushed caliche six inches of base cinders imported from New Mexico and topped with three inches of fine cinders mixed with 12 percent clay binder.

Inside of this new addition Permian High will be a regulation football field, plus a circle for discus and shot put. Along the sides will be run ways and pits for broad jump, high jump and pole vault.
