
Across the hall from the main gym is a small room that is set aside for all kinds of decisions, important and otherwise.

Construction is under way on the new track for Permian High. It is six inches of base cinders import being built south of the building from New Mexico and topped wi running parallel with Dawn Ave.

Inside of this new addition Permian High will be a regulation football field, plus a circle for di cus and shot put. Along the sid jump, high jump and pole vault.


